The following is an offense report written by Sgt. J. Smith of the Lynn Haven Police Department with regards to a Criminal Mischief designated by LHPD Case: 16-09482.

On 08/26/16 at or about 7:16 AM, I responded to 206 Kentucky Avenue in reference to a damaged mailbox. I spoke with the victim/complainant, David Parker, sometime between 6:00 PM on 08/25/16 and 6:00 AM on 08/26/16 an unknown person damaged his mailbox. Parker believes that the damage occurred sometime around 1:00 AM because it was around that time his dogs started barking and he heard a loud noise followed by what sounded to be a vehicle with loud exhaust driving away from the area. Parker described the loud noise as a "crash" or "bang" sound. I examined the mailbox and determined that it had been struck with an unknown object on the north facing side causing approximately \$25.00 worth of damage. Parker had bent the mailbox prior to my arrival so that it was able to be closed. Photographs of the mailbox were obtained and attached to the case file.

The following is an offense report written by Sgt. J. Smith of the Lynn Haven Police Department with regards to an Informational Report designated by LHPD Case: 16-09483.

On 08/26/16 at or about 7:16 AM, I

responded to 206 Kentucky Avenue in reference to a damaged mailbox. Refer to LHPD Case: 16-09482 for further information. While speaking with the victim/complainant, he informed me that his neighbor at 114 Kentucky had also had her mailbox damaged the night prior.

I made contact with Theresia Buccelli, who resides at 114 Kentucky Avenue, and she informed me that sometime last night an unknown person removed her mailbox from its post and placed it in her driveway and then removed the post from the ground and placed it nearby in the ditch. When Buccelli found the mailbox she re-attached the mailbox to the post and placed the mailbox back into the ground.

Buccelli does not know who removed her mailbox post and placed it on the ground. I examined the mailbox and found the ground surrounding the post was loose as if it had been recently removed from the ground. I found no damage to the mailbox or the post. Photographs were taken and attached to the case file.

Due to a lack of damage this case was classified as an informational report and closed. LHPD OFFICER SMITH

LHPD Case: 16-09482 for further information. After speaking with the victim, David Parker, I BOLD'd the area for additional victims and located a damaged mailbox at 211 Carolina Avenue. The metal mailbox appeared to have been struck with an unknown object causing it to slant right and making it so the mailbox door was unable to be closed. A second dent was present on top of the mailbox suggesting it had been struck from above. The damage was estimated at about \$30.00. Photographs of the damaged mailbox were

attached to the case file.

I made contact with the resident, Tia N. May who confirmed that the mailbox had been damaged the night prior sometime between 8:00 PM on 08/25/16 and 7:00 AM on 08/26/16 by an unknown person. LHPD OFFICER SMITH

Photographs of the damaged mailbox were attached to the case file. I made contact with the resident, Joshua Entenman, who confirmed that the mailbox had been damaged the night by an unknown person.
